Student Achievement

Our program seeks to produce planners who are ethical, engaged, and committed to ensuring inclusive, equitable, healthy, resilient, and sustainable communities. Our methods for measuring student achievement include: (1) alumni self-assessment of their knowledgebase and expertise; (2) formal exit interviews or surveys from Departmental Chair; (3) quality of capstone projects and/or final studio projects assessed by outside reviewers' projects as a synthesis learning outcome; and 4) preparation to realize next order goals after graduation. To assess this later goal, Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 graduates were surveyed to determine whether their undergraduate professional degree prepared them for employment in a government planning office or complementary fields that used planning applications. Of the graduates, 65% had acquired a planning position within three months of graduation, 7% had taken a non-planning position, and 28% were accepted into graduate programs.
